On a Hill Far Away

On top of a bluff that overlooks the big creek and the railroad track that cut through town, a large cross stands on the edge of the city cemetery in Thayer. My grandfather lies buried a few feet away. It is the perfect place for him: he was a railroad man, and he liked the rushing of the river. Though I never knew him, as he and my grandmother and my mother refused to mend fences, I saw his grave every year on Easter, when the entire town gathered at the cross for Sunrise Service at 6:00 a.m. It was quiet – birds' songs trilling through the air, new leaves rustling gently, and faint sounds of the water below and a melancholy train whistle. Somehow, it seemed right to go on Easter morning looking not to roll the stone away, but to hope for my grandfather's

peace, because mere weeks before his unexpected death when I was 10, he had decided that his hope was in Jesus' resurrection, and had tried to reunite with his daughter and granddaughters. My mission was not clear to me then – oh, I knew I wanted to go and see his grave, but I didn't know why. Now, however, a lifetime later, I realize what I was looking for, and I find peace with that: the hope that comes with the knowledge of the resurrection – that what was lost can be found, that what was broken might be mended, and though storms will come, the calm can follow. May you feel hope at Easter.
